



Enhanced Knowledge-Students gained a deeper understanding of the historical and cultural significance of SangeetMahalNavarasapur.


Cultural Appreciation- The visit fostered a greater appreciation for local heritage and architecture.

Feedback:


- Participants and attendees expressed positive feedback, noting the importance of such initiatives in promoting democratic values.

Outcomes:


- Students gained practical insights into historical and cultural heritage.
